2003



January

On the 14th we had the funeral of Mr. Thomas Tannis Markovitch at the Church. This was our rst Gypsy funeral and as such very colorful. The visitation at the funeral home was three full days with lots of food and many relatives.

We celebrated the 88th birthday of Mrs. Baldasso in the back of the Church. Originally from Italy, she immigrated to Canada in 1950. She lives now with her son and is very very grateful for the Church and being a member here.

Fr. Jürgen injured his back at work while moving a casket at the end of January. He was bed bound for several weeks and returned to work part-time in April.

April

On the 4th our long time member Eddy Ydenberg passed away suddenly from a heart attack. Eddy and his wife Doris attended St. Raphael's for close to 25 years and were two of the oldest members. Originally from Holland, he came to Canada after he served in the war. He was well liked and many stories are connected with him. Since he lived close to the Church there were many times he would stop by or call, or the Priests would visit with him. The Requiem Mass was celebrated on the 10th. A very stately service. The Church was over owing

with many family and friends, including the former Premier of our province, Mr. Bill Vander Zalm and his wife.

At the end of the month Fr. Gordon took ill and had to go to the hospital for a week. He returned all well and rejuvenated.

May

We received as a donation from Mrs. McKenzie a concrete fountain, made in Chicago 1932 for the rectory gardens. It has been xed up and is now working perfectly.

After many years nally a new roof is put on the Church. The roof hasn't been renewed for at least 40 years - not bad for shingles designed for 15 years! The new roof has a 40 year warranty and we hope we don't need to touch the roof for a long time. This work was made possible by a very generous donation of Mr. Doug Stewart and his wife Huguette, who have been long time friends and supporter of the Church. The Bishop married them more than 20 years ago, and we have known them since. The work was done by Whannock Roo ng, owner Mr. Clayton Gagnon Sr., who helped us over the years many times to x the roof and repair it. The roo ng crew were: Mr. Clayton Gagnon Jr., Mr. Rees Geannott, Mr. Richard Abbott, and Mr. Darrell Wiebe.

August

New gutters were installed at the Church to complement the new roof at the beginning of the month by Mr. Ray Mattice and his crew. They also put new gutters on Fr. Gordon's carport and the garage.

On August 29 we received the sad news that one of our long-time members, Mrs. Susan Green suddenly passed away. Her death was a shock for everyone, because though she had been sick not even her doctor expected her to die. She was born 9 September 1945 in Calgary, Alberta, and was a High-School teacher in Richmond for most of her life. She and her husband, Robert have been faithful

to our Church, and their two children were baptized here. She retired in July of this year. The Requiem Mass was held at St. Raphael's on September 10, with more than 200 people in attendance, many were forced to stand outside in the rain. Her ashes were laid to rest in our small cemetery at the Church, next to the ashes of her parents and sister.

September

Mr. Jürgen Alsbach and his father Mr. Theo Alsbach came for a visit. After a big dinner on Saturday, and a small Church reception on Sunday they left together with Bishop LaPlante for a well deserved trip to Northwestern USA.

October

Fr. Jürgen went to Germany to visit with his family. His parents are celebrating their 45th wedding anniversary and he was happy to be part of this special family celebration.

November

Fr. Gary Wulf and his wife from Holy Trinity Anglican Church in Redmond, Washington came for a visit. Fr. Gary is also a working Priest, and he recently retired from US Postal Service. Holy Trinity Anglican Church is in Communion with the Old Catholic Church, because a few years ago Holy Trinity needed a Bishop and asked Bishop LaPlante whether he could help them. Bishop LaPlante graciously accepted and became their Bishop as well.

In November, we also had the wedding of Mr. Nishanth Luke Thangasamy and Mrs. Rojimaserella Pauline. They are both from South India; he belongs to the Church of India, she is Catholic. Both are students here in Vancouver. After the wedding in the Church, everyone was invited for a small reception in the back. Mr. Thangasamy, who enjoys music very much, sang with Fr. Gordon on the organ. They came to us through our long time member Mr. Ramesh Bastiampillai, who has helped the Church in many di erent ways over the years. 2004

January

In the past two years, we have celebrated a Requiem Mass once a month at Ocean View Burial Park, Burnaby, BC at 11 am on the rst Saturday of each month. In November we had big problems securing our usual time slot and after a letter was written to the President of the Company, our usual time slot has been secured for the rest of the year.

February

We are now in full communion with Holy Trinity Anglican Church, in Redmond, Washington, USA. Quote from the minutes of annual meeting: "... Father Gary asked for a vote to have Bishop LaPlante as our Bishop...there was unanimous vote in favor of the Letter of Communion...Father Gary said that the Bishop is the most unassuming Bishop he has ever met, very humble, and the Bishop believes that he is a priest—rst and a Bishop second...If our Churches have a communion agreement, there will be no money exchanged, and each parish will be completely independent." he served at St. Jude Roman Catholic parish. He visited St. Raphael's when he was in Vancouver, and Bishop LaPlante met him on several occasions in New Brunswick, where he resided. A dedicated Priest with a sharp mind he will be missed from our midst.

Easter

We were very busy during Holy Week and had the Church packed to the brims on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter. Fortunately, we had extraordinary good weather with over 20C, Many visitors and members had to stand outside the Church simple could not hold all the people.

On Holy Saturday, we had 8 baptisms, on Easter Sunday, 1 baptism. Five Children of the baptisms are already 2nd generation Old Catholic! We had 3 baptisms from Burundi (Andreas and Harmony Weber are from Burundi, the father is German, the mother Burundi) as well as Igor Iragabanje. We also had 5 con rmations and 5 First Communions.

On the second Sunday of Easter, we celebrated two very special baptisms of Mrs. Myrtle Sawiuk, 82 years, and Mrs. Margaret Marino, 85 years old. They are two sisters, born in Rocky Bay, BC, a true pioneer family. Their parents were born in BC on Vancouver Island and most of their children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and greatgreat-grandchildren live and work in our province. Their father worked in the logging camps in BC, their husbands in the mining and shing industry. Both of them were married 3 times and both of them are now widowed having survived their husbands.

They always had a deep love and appreciation for the First Nation people in our province and their children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren have intermingled and intermarried with the nations of our province. They are a living example of the tolerance and acceptance, which so much re ects the teaching of the Old Catholic Church of BC.

The father of the now 82 and 85 year old sisters had a disagreement with a Roman Catholic priest and therefore vowed not to have his children baptized. It took the healing angel of St. Raphael of the Old Catholic Church to lead the two sisters to the waters of baptism. They knew how important it was because their children and grandchildren were all baptized. Mrs. Myrtle Sawiuk had her great-greatgrandson baptized at St. Raphael's Old Catholic Church last year. When Myrtle told her 85-yearold sister Margaret of her plans to be baptized at St. Raphael's Old Catholic Church, she also wanted to be baptized. Margaret's spiritual journey has led her from the Roman Catholic Church to the Jehovah's Witness to the Old Catholic Church of BC. Myrtle came to us via the Anglican Church.



We wish him Godspeed and hope he will be back, as he was well liked by everyone in the Church. For his farewell breakfast, we invited Mrs. Louise Heide as well, because she has been the oldest member in our Church having been at the Church for more than 30 years. Now mostly homebound it was a great joy for her to join again in the fellowship of our community. New gutters where installed on the rectory to compliment the new roof. Everything works ne and it was rain tested the next day with superior results.

At the end of May, we also received the sad news that our roofer Mr. Clayton Gagnon Sr. died suddenly at the age of 54 of a heart attack. He has been a friend of Bishop LaPlante and the Church for more than 25 years and his death came as a shock to everyone. He helped install gutters at the Church over 27 years ago, and the new roof in 2003. Bishop LaPlante o ciated at his funeral in Maple Ridge, where he was also buried.

July A new monument for our Cemetery in Surrey

The Church purchased from Mrs. Louise Heide 9 plots for the use of the Church at Valley View Cemetery in 1993. Over the years other members have used the cemetery services, so that in total more than 14 plots have been sold because of the Old Catholic Church of BC. Since 1995, we wanted a monument built for the Church. Many years of discussions with the cemetery followed. At one point, they wanted us to pay more than \$150,000 for a small monument. Of course, we refused. Bishop LaPlante had found a very suitable cross, which was designed and used in a native cemetery. We restored the antique cross and the cemetery gave us a natural stone on which the cross will stand. On the stone will also be a plaque from our Church in two languages.

September

During the visit of Mr. Jürgen Alsbach and his father the Hon. Mr. Theo Alsbach, retired Supreme Court Judge from Germany, new Plexiglas was installed at the alley side of the Church. In late October this work was completed by installing new Plexiglas on the garden side of the Church and on the rectory. They make quite a big di erence because they cut out the draft and the noise from the street and outside.

One carpenter commented that if we would have not installed the Plexiglas this year, next year we could have started to install new windows, which would have been much more expensive.

November

Bishop LaPlante was invited to participate in the o cial opening ceremony of the newly built Richmond Funeral Home in Richmond, BC. Together with the Mayor of Richmond Mr. Malcolm Brodie, and the Senior Vice-President of the Arbor Group (owner of Richmond Funeral Home), Mr. John Earle, Bishop LaPlante cut the ribbon and gave a special blessing to the new facility.

For one week in November we received a visit from Fr. Sylvain Tremblay from Montreal and Fr. Claude Lacroix from Quebec City. Fr. Claude studied at Laval University before joining the Carmelite Order in France for 9 years. In 1985 he was ordained Priest by an Old Catholic Church in Quebec and has been a working Priest since then. He will be our representative in Quebec with Fr. Sylvain.

Mrs. Gee was an extremely caring mother and grandmother who worked very hard for her family. She always put her sons and grandchildren ahead of everything else. The family gratefully thanked Bishop Gérard LaPlante of the Old Catholic Church of BC for his assistance through a di cult time. A private family service was held by Bishop LaPlante on December 23, 2004. RIP.




