

On 26th of April 2021, the landmark Church of Ste-Anne in Listuguj, Québec burned down.

On August 25, 1996, Bishop Gérard LaPlante celebrated Holy Mass at that Church with the Reverend Father, Jean Vianney Daigneault, OFM Cap. (RIP), who was the last resident parish priest. He died on 26 September 1998. A funeral Mass was held on Listugui Reservation on 3 October 1998, and he was buried at the same location. Formerly, he was a missionary in India for 45 years.
